

APPALACHIAN STATE UNIVERSITY University Recreation (UREC) Trip Staff

Trip Staff is primarily responsible for providing a safe, inclusive and welcoming environment for all participants on trips. UREC places emphasis on educating participants on the specific outdoor activity in which they are participating. Trip leaders are responsible for providing an environment that welcomes all participants: beginner to expert. UREC seeks staff who possess knowledge and experience in a variety of outdoor recreation activities. Some of these activities include, but not limited to; Bouldering, day hiking to multi-day backpacking, canoeing, whitewater paddling, top rope rock climbing, stand-up paddle boarding (SUP), and caving. UREC seeks those who exhibit an outgoing and friendly personality with commitment to learning and teaching. Equipment maintenance and cleaning procedures will be conducted after each trip. Trip staff will be required to participate in an Intro to Outdoor Programs weeklong trip prior to employment. The staff progression will vary based on prior experience and certifications.

Supervisor: This position reports directly to the Coordinator for Outdoor Programs.

Hours: Trip Staff will work as needed during certain times of the Semester. Hours vary based on the trip you are leading.

Salary: Compensation based on the length of the trip and position.

Responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Fully participate in trip planning; including trip goal planning, route planning, food and equipment organization/packing, and vehicle loading.
- Supports the other trip leader in all aspects of trip safety; identifying, assessing and managing environmental and social risk.
- Demonstrates the ability to behave as a role model for participants, able to manage a range of participant needs in a positive manner
- Be able to manage a group and all emergencies with a co-trip leader.
- Able to locate and use communication systems in the event of an emergency (cell phone, satellite phone, ranger station, etc.)
- Follow UREC systems to ensure a high functioning program. Packing, cleaning, and repairing gear.
- Provide clear, effective and timely communication with supervisor, co-trip leader, and other staff. Committed to openly sharing and receiving feedback from staff.
- Take photos while on the trip for program use.
- Promote a safe, equitable, and inclusive environment for all participants.
- Activity specific skills you may be responsible for include; building anchors, providing a
 belay, basic water craft maneuvering, setting handlines, navigation via map and
 compass, etc.
- Complete near/miss incident reports as necessary
- Enact the emergency call list in a timely fashion for emergency situations.
- Maintain appropriate supervision of all participants.
- Be on time with arriving and departing for scheduled trips.
- Be able to complete tasks efficiently and without direct supervision
- Follow all Outdoor Programs field policies and procedures and emergency action plan
- Other duties as assigned.

Required qualifications:

- CPR/AED, First Aid Certification or ability to obtain within 21 days of first day of employment (UREC will provide this training upon hire)
- Wilderness First Responder (WFR) Certification through a school that follows the <u>Wilderness Medicine Education Collaborative (WMEC) certification standards</u> (Can be completed after hire)
- N.C. Epinephrine Administration Certification (Can be completed after hire)
- Valid Driver's License with a driving record that allows for being an authorized driver with the University.
- Required to participate in an Intro to Outdoor Programs weeklong trip prior to being hired
- Required to pick and attend either a Land Based extended trip or a Water Based extended trip

Additional qualifications (not required):

- Provide a trip log proving evidence of technical skills and previous accredited training (skill specific: i.e. rock climbing, backpacking, white water, etc.)
- Pre-existing experience in one or more of the following:
 - Day hiking and navigation
 - Multi-Day Backpacking Excursions

- Rock climbing guide or; ability to climb routes with a rating of 5.7 or greater, can properly put on a harness/helmet, and tie a figure 8 follow through.
- Whitewater rafting, canoeing, or kayak guiding or; ability to maneuver a craft in class I-II rapids or greater effectively, able to self-rescue if having an out-of-boat experience, and able to conduct basic river safety skills/knowledge.
- Swift Water Rescue Certification of Completion
- AMGA Single Pitch Instructor or Similar Certifications
- Climbing Wall Instructor Certification
- ACA Certification (canoeing, whitewater, kayak, etc.)
